

## Make God Bigger – Day 21

*Yehoshua (Jesus) – Yahweh Saves*

Jesus. What a beautiful name it is. What comfort, healing, and love are bound up in that name. What power and majesty. It is the name given to save us (Acts 4:12) from a never-ending life of tears and trouble. While we live on this earth, it is a sanctuary of peace where we can run in the face of life's difficulties.
